#### **Headlines from crime statistics**

- Total notifiable offences fell by 6.3%
- All other crime categories above, except robbery are down
- Robbery has increased by 1.0%
- Homicide is down by 7 offences. If however, the 2005/06 total is reduced by the victims of the Tavistock Square bus bomb, this shows a rise in homicide between 2005/06 and 2006/07 of 6. Nevertheless, 2006/07 would be the second lowest year since 1998/99 (2005/06 is the lowest) even with those victims included.
- Gun enabled crime has fallen 11.3% against an MPS 4% reduction target, trident gun crime is down 15%
- The 6.8% reduction in BCS comparator crime has exceeded the MPS 6.3% reduction target.
- TNO sanction detection rate for 2006/07 year to date is 21.1%; the MPS has a 20% target.
- Sanction detection rates are up for each of the three hate crime categories, by at least 11
  percentage points.

## Public Satisfaction Information (unchanged from last month, next results due in May)

#### Key messages from the surveys

#### **British Crime Survey**

 Confidence in local policing remains steady and the MPS leads it's Most Similar Force group in this indicator.

## **Public Attitudes Survey**

- Overall confidence and satisfaction in policing remains higher than in 2004/05, but not at the exceptionally high levels seen in 2005/06.
- The exceptional trends in quarter 2 an increase in worry about anti-social behaviour, poorer ratings of 'community relations' and 'being kept informed' – have been reversed in quarter 3.

## **Safer Neighbourhoods Performance Framework**

• This shows mixed results: worry about anti-social behaviour increased slightly, but people feel safer walking alone after dark.

## **Crime Victim Satisfaction Survey**

- The overall level of satisfaction with total service remains steady, currently on average at 79%.
- The gap between white and BME victims overall satisfaction with the service has closed slightly, with the gap at 6 percentage points, down from 7.

#### **Anti Social Behaviour Satisfaction Survey**
