Airwave Programme Board	This is a sub-committee of the Police Information Technology Organisation which oversees the Airwave project. The Clerk is currently a member and continuation of her appointment is recommended.
Joint Steering Group for Community Safety in London	<p>The purpose of this group is to co-ordinate and provide information about best practice in relation to crime and disorder partnerships. It is chaired by the Deputy Commissioner and the membership includes the Chief Executives of a number of London boroughs, together with representatives of the ALG, the Prison Service, Probation Service, other pan-London agencies, the Crime Reduction Director for London and representatives of other police forces in London.</p> <p>The Deputy Commissioner invites MPA representation. It is suggested that this be through one officer – the Clerk is recommended – and one Member, possibly from the Planning Panel (which was formerly known as the Oversight Panel).</p> <p>It meets quarterly, and the next meeting is on 25 September at 2.30 pm.</p>
