

## Appendix 5

### Draft Targets 2006/7

**Target 1: Narrowing the Justice Gap***Offences Brought to Justice (OBTJ)*

To increase the number of offences brought to justice in London to 179,483

*Ineffective Trials*

- To reduce the ineffective trials rate in the Magistrates' Courts to no more than 20% of all listed trials
- To reduce the ineffective trials rate in the Crown Courts to no more than 15%

*NB. BCJGs will be given bespoke targets for both OBTJ and ineffective trials which collectively will meet the London-wide target.*

Trial Delays

To achieve an average waiting time of 10 weeks or less.

Probation Reports

To increase the number of Reports on the day to 40% of all reports provided to London Magistrates' Courts.

*Victims and Witnesses*

To increase the proportion of victims and witnesses who are satisfied with the London Criminal Justice System. (Baselines from WAVES surveys to be set in May 2006)

**Target 2: Increasing Public Confidence in the CJS**

To demonstrate a 4% increase in the proportion of Londoners who are very or fairly confident that the CJS is effective in bringing offenders to justice. (Target to be met by end March 2007 – baseline 45%).

**Target 3: Persistent Young Offenders**

To achieve an average time of 71 days from arrest to sentence for persistent young offenders.

**Target 4: Enforcement***Execution of Failure to appear (FTA) warrants:*

- 90% of FTA warrants to be notified within one working day, with 100% within 3 working days.
- To reduce the total number of outstanding MPS & CofL FTA warrants by 15% to 8,700 (based upon a projected March 06 outturn of 10,235).

*Benchmarks*

- (70%) of category A warrants to be executed within 14 days
- (60%) of category B warrants to be executed within 21 days
- (50%) of category C warrants to be executed within 28 days

*Enforcement of financial penalties:*

To achieve a London average payment rate of 75%

*Asset Recovery*

- To increase the volume of confiscation orders secured during 06/07 by 20% to 452
- To increase the value of confiscation orders secured during 05/06 by 35% to £17,082,978
- To reduce the outstanding collectable balance rate to 25% for confiscation orders made under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 (POCA).
- To reduce by 35% the number of collectable confiscation orders made under earlier asset recovery legislation.

*Community Penalties:*

- To achieve an average of 35 working days from the absence triggering breach proceedings to resolution of the case.
- To resolve 50% of breaches of community penalties within 25 working days of the absence triggering breach proceedings.
