




The above graph shows the total number of OBTJs achieved by the MPS (and Criminal Justice partners) over the twelve months September 05 to August 06. There is likely to be a small increase in the figures for July and August as PNDs make their way through the system. The individual performance for each outcome is shown on the next page. The 'dip' in April appears to happen each year and may be explained by all agencies maximising their outcomes at the end of the previous performance year. The overall trend is for sustained improvement and current targets are being exceeded.










Appendix 1b

The trend lines on these charts show the growth in OBTJs achieved by the MPS over the previous year. The conviction chart indicates level performance, but this does not account for the increase in other areas reducing convictions e.g. an offence that would have been a conviction is now dealt with by PND. The PND data does not show the last two months performance, as there is a delay in receiving accurate data. This would be overcome should we move to the electronic issue of PNDs. Preliminary analysis indicates a similar rise in performance. The TIC data will always be more erratic than the other indicators. because it relies on individual offenders admitting offending.
