Appendix 1

Introduction

The report begins with a summary of performance against the Crime continues to fall across London, with almost 57,000 fewer "critical 13", the major indicators the MPS is to be monitored against in the Policing Plan (Appendix 2). Appendix 3 is a report of all of the other targets and Statutory Performance Indicators (SPIs) on which the MPS is monitored.

The information compares the target with the performance during the performance year to date (PYTD) and the rolling 12 months where this is available. The rolling 12 months figure balances the PYTD data, as it is not distorted by seasonal factors. Performance against target is shown as a traffic light.

The Home Office iQuanta rankings (1 = best and 5 = worst) are now included where relevant. The MPS is compared against its Most Similar Forces (MSF) - Greater Manchester, Merseyside, West Midlands and West Yorkshire).

Performance – April 2006 to January 2007

offences since April 2006 compared with the same period in 2005/06. The MPS has improved its sanction detection performance, with the SD rate now at it's highest since 1998. The MPS also leads its MSF group with respect to the public's confidence in local policing.

Five of the critical 13 are on target, five are missing the targets and a further three do not have a target. Amongst the five missing their target, only one is significantly off target, the others are marginal - we expect criminal networks and BCS comparator crime to be on target by the end of the year. Of the critical indicators on target, BCS violence is currently showing a reduction of 7% against a 5% target, and the sanction detection rate for all crime is well above target (21% vs. 20% target).

Gun crime is also a key area of good performance – the current performance is one of a 13.7% drop in gun-enabled crime so far this year. Some areas for improvement remain:

- Overall victim satisfaction (79% vs. 81% target)
- Victims of racist incidents satisfaction at 62% (72% target)
- Perceptions of anti-social behaviour (26% vs. 24% target)

In the remainder of the Policing Plan indicators, there are many areas of success:

- 11 indicators are on target
- 3 are off target

Blue background of green traffic light indicates the MPS has achieved 10% or better than target



MPS needs 391 or fewer gun enabled crimes each month in order to meet the MPA target of a 4% reduction.


