Commentary on Proposals

- i) Order of Priorities There is no order of precedence with the priorities and to reinforce this they have been assigned letters with numbers allocated to the supporting objectives
- ii) Reduction of Murder There is no dispute that this should appear within the list of MPS objectives particularly in view of the recent HMIC inspection and the Damilola Taylor report. Discussions are taking place with Specialist Crime on whether it should be included as a stand alone objective with its own targets and measures. Alternatively it could be a measure of success underneath the objectives relating to criminal use of firearms, drug gun and human trafficking, and domestic violence
- iii) Autocrime The MPS does not propose to include autocrime as a specific objective within the APP. However each borough OCU has been asked to set a bespoke target that reflects the size of the local problem and is linked to the

content of the local C&D strategy. It is intended that there will be a statement in the front end of the APP that will link with the direction and long term targets to be set out in the Strategic Plan (including the approach to achieving the PSA target)

- iv) Anti Social Behaviour Similarly to autocrime, the MPS intends to set out under key initiatives in the front end of the plan what is being done locally about anti social behaviour through C&D strategies, without making it a specific objective in the APP
- v) Vulnerable victims The MPS does not intend to extend this definition to include victims of fatal road traffic accidents

Commentary on Proposals

i) Managing demands on the MPS – Following discussion with MPA members the MPS is content to propose targets and measures around the C3(i) and Airwave projects in lieu of dedicated objectives if appropriate. Discussions will take place with the programme co-ordinator to establish what those targets and measures might entail. The MPS is considering whether it is possible to include these activities and their supporting targets and measures under 'making best use of our staff and resources'.

The MPS is also examining the recommendations from the 'managing demand/operational policing' best value review to establish whether there are more appropriate objectives to support this priority eg access to police services

- ii) **Programme of devolution** The MPS may wish to amend Objective 8 to 'to *continue* the programme of devolution ...' to reflect the proposed slower roll out to boroughs in order for informed evaluation of the programme
- iii) To implement the Communication Action Plan The MPS is keen to have a priority/objective that recognises the improvement needed and potential benefits to the organisation of successful communication. The MPS recognises that this proposal has been put forward after the original priorities were agreed. The MPS is therefore prepared for improved communication to become an objective under an existing priority provided that it is explicit in the final set of objectives, and is considering how best this should be addressed
