# MPA High Level Indicators Specialist Crime Commentary



1. Homicide Target: 90% YTD: 79%

#### Comments:

Although below target, the YTD performance is an improvement on the previous year. At 3rd January 2002 murders stood at 143 - detected 95 - clear up rate of 66.43%

This improved performance has continued into February 2002 compared with February 2001: 6th February 2003 (8th February 2002) Murders: 162(177) Detections: 132 (120) Clear up Rate: 81%(68%)

MPA/Management Board have agreed a growth in the Homicide Commands Budgeted Workforce Target (BWT), in order to increase the size of investigation teams, that will allow for more flexibility and management intervention regarding the deployment of Homicide Investigation resources. However there are restrictions on the Serious Crime Group recruiting within the MPS, these will be lifted in April 2003

## 2. Cross Border & Organised Crime

Target: 10% increase

YTD: 35%

#### Comments:

Year to date April 2001 - December 2001 (22.01%)

Year to date April 2002 - December 2002 (35%)

Comparisons of the data show that our year to date total percentage is currently 13% above the year to date total for the matching period of the previous year. Achievement of this figure is attributed to:

- · Improvements to the Intelligence flow of information within the Command by improved processes and the increase in staff.
- The creation of a Crime Management Unit within the Command.
- The creation of a Shooting Investigation Team within the Command.
- · An increase to the Budgeted Workforce Target (BWT) for the Shooting Investigation Team.
- $\cdot$  The allocation of resources to increase the operational capability of the units.
- Improvements to the IT infrastructure within the Command.
- · The creation of a one document system to collate the required information

### 3. Child Protection

Target: **29%** YTD: **41%** 

## Comments:

For the year 2002/03, the target for Child Protection is to achieve a notifiable clear-up rate of 29%. The OCU is currently performing above this target at 41%.

The data is supplied by the Performance Information Bureau (PIB) from the Crime Reporting Information System (CRIS). This data is due to be revised by PIB which will affect future crime and clear up statistics. This is due to the number of victims not being properly recorded. This was identified shortly after the establishment of the OCU's Crime Management Unit.

## 4. Specialist & Economic Crime

## Target: **65%** YTD: **82%**

#### Comments:

The target for this year is to detect 65% of reported specialist crime. This target is currently being exceeded by 17% with a YTD total of 82% This is attributable to two initiatives. Firstly, improvements to the case management process by increased supervision by line managers and a monthly performance meeting where Unit heads are held accountable for their span of responsibility.

This will continue to be a local plan objective for the next financial year, with the target detection rate being raised to 70%.

## **5. Intelligence** Target: **Awaits** YTD:

#### Comments:

There is some debate around the targets and measures to be applied to the objective relating to the trafficking of Class A drugs, firearms and humans. This is a new area of business and the processes and systems have not been developed to capture meaningful output data. The lead unit are addressing this issue for the forthcoming year.

For 2003/04 confirmation is awaited from discussions with the MPA and Corporate Planning as to the exact measure and target for this activity.

#### Comments:

The percentage of burglary scenes attended has exceeded the set target. The recruitment of additional Crime Scene Examiners suggests a positive impact on the number scenes attended

The percentage of homicide scenes attended by Crime Scenes Managers within 1 hour of the request time is now 97%, an achievement of 2% above the 95% target. Following a six monthly review, it was decided that the 1 hour response time was an unrealistic target, this was then extended to 1½ hours. There was no baseline data available when original target was set. It was discovered that staff were facing great difficulties in reaching scenes because of the volume/congestion levels of traffic. The percentage of search of arrestee fingerprints for young offenders within 24 hours has dropped to

The percentage of search of arrestee fingerprints for young offenders within 24 hours has dropped to 79%, 11% below the set target. The reasons for this are:

- increased down time of the National Automated Fingerprint Identification Service (NAFIS) system
- the team undertake work in many crime areas and recently there has been a strong demand for checks linked to terrorist investigations
- the option to revert to a manual procedure no longer exists, there is a complete dependency on system reliability/accessibility

## Specialist Crime Directorate - Overall Summary

#### Comments:

Three of the commands within Specialist Crime Directorate are currently exceeding their 2002/03 targets. Cross Border and Organised Crime have achieved a year to date total which is currently 13% above that of the same period of the previous year. This can be attributed in part to the flow of Intelligence information, the creation of several new units/teams within the Operational Command Unit (OCU), as well as improved resource allocation and increase in personnel.

Homicide, although currently performing below their targeted detection rate, have improved their performance compared to the same period of the previous year. An agreed increase in the Commands BWT by Management Board will allow for more flexibility in the deployment of Homicide investigation resources and an increase in the size of Investigation teams available. The restrictions on recruitment currently in place for the Command will be lifted in April of this year when an improvement in performance should become evident.

The report in its current format will remain until the end of this financial year. From April 2003 onwards it is envisaged that the contents will reflect the measures and targets featured in the MPA/MPS Policing Plan. This will enable the tracking of performance on each objective where Specialist Crime are the lead in service delivery to be clearly demonstrated and visible.

#### Comments:

For the planning year 2002-2003 to date SO13 have hit or exceeded all their targets, maintaining this performance despite heightened concerns regarding possible terrorist activity.

#### Comments:

Royalty Protection (SO14) have met their target of 0 unlawful intrusions to the protected secure residence of the principle, in line with the previous year. This is the result of tried and tested, but constantly reviewed, security arrangements.

The Diplomatic Protection Group (SO16) was unable to achieve their target 6 minutes for Emergency Requests for mobile responses due to congested traffic conditions within the Trafalgar Square area. For the planning year 2003/04 it is proposed that the target be amended to 85% response within 6 minutes of an emergency call. Congestion charging and proposed changes to raod layout will be taken into consideration. Response time for the rest of the MPS is, generally, 75% within 12 minutes. There is 100% provision of armed security to Palace of Westminster and Ceremonial & State events. These tend to fall in June (Trooping the Colour & Beating the retreat) and November (Festival of

These tend to fall in June (Trooping the Colour & Beating the retreat) and November (Festival of Remembrance, Remembrance Sunday, State opening of Parliament & AJAX) but were added to during 2002 by Queen Mothers Funeral (April) and Golden Jubilee (June). Armed security at the Residences of visiting Heads of State is supplied in responce to a risk assessment by Special Branch, to whom SO16 mainly supply aid at night.

The Palace of Westminster Division (SO17) for the YTD has not achieved its target regarding responses to personal attack and intruder alarms. However, this has been mainly due to discrepancies with the recording of time of arrival on CAD - isolated location of some alarms (inspection covers in road & roof spaces) and buildings not staffed at weekends -, this has now been addressed and improvements in this area are expected. Seizure of weapons at Strangers Galleries is well within target. As the year-to-date total is 1% an even tighter target ot <5% is being proposed for 2003/04.

#### **Comments:**

The amount of time spent on Directed Patrol has remained steady and well above target, this has lead to a substancial increase to the proposed target for 2003-4 (61%).

The Firearms Unit (SO19) has consistently maintained a good/satisfactory rating for its training above the 80% target, despite an ever increasing work load which has lead to the increase in the number of instructors from 53 to 72.

Heathrow (ID) has no recorded terrorist incidents since March 1994 and is determined to adopt the appropriate security measures to combat any percieved threat.

# 10. Special Branch

**Targets**

#### Comments:

Special Branch (SO12) are performing above target for each of their High Level Performance Indicators. The Performance Indicator for Counter Terrorism Checks, Special Clearances & Developed Vetting was changed in August 2002, the result of delays at the Security Service, to better reflect the input of SO12. All the Urgent or High Priority Actions have been reponded to within the specified time. However, there have been none since June 2002.

The year-to-date total for Priority Operations is based upon operations in progress on a monthly basis. If an operation overlaps from one month to another then this may cause double counting for the year-to-date figures. This should not affect the overall percentage as all the data has been treated the same way.

#### Comments:

Character Enquiries Centre (CEC) undertake pre-employment checks for the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) on people who will have access to children and vulnerable adults. CEC currently falls considerably short of its target, with 24% of enquiries completed within 10 working days in Quarter 3. However, this is the first year for CEC/CRB and they have experienced many start up problems: with lower than expected volumes, data quality issues and software problems. In December 2002 a recovery programme was agreed with the CRB and since then Character Enquiries have exceeded the plan targets. A recruitment exercise is underway with new staff joining Character Enquiries in February/March 2003. Vetting Enquiries undertake security checks on behalf of Government agencies. The YTD performance is currently below target at 72%. However, this is mainly the result of poor performance in Quarter 1; since then recommendations from a self review have been implemented and have resulted in sustained improvement.

Method Index Office maintains a computerised database of criminal methodology and undertakes searches for UK Police Forces. Performance is currently below target with YTD 74%. Work force levels have been increased and performance for Quarter 3 was above target at 83%.

# **Specialist Operations - Overall Summary**

#### Comments:

The planning year 2002-2003 has been a busy one for Specialist Operations (SO) with issues such as: implementing the changes post 9/11, possibility of renewed conflict with Iraq and the split with Specialist Crime. Performance for the year to date has generally been good, with 13 of our High Level Performance Indicators being met or, often, exceeded - this includes 0 terrorist attacks on London. Where targets have not been met, for example with SO4 Vetting Enquiries and Method Index and SO17 Personal Attack / Intruder Alarms, the provision of this service has been analysed and a solution quickly found and implemented. Where solutions have been outside the control of the MPS, for example Mobile Responses to Diplomatic / Government buildings then re-appraisal of the performance indicator in this area has had to be undertaken, in order to make the target more realistic and achievable. This good performance is built on a professional and flexible approach to policing in a difficult political environment utilising the co-operation with other MPS commands as well as National and International Policing and other associated organisations built up over many years of consistent good service.
