# Specialist Operations Comments

### 1

#### **Counter Terrorism**

SO13

For the planning year 2003/04 to date SO13 has maintained its strong performance from 2002/03, meeting or exceeding targets on all of its High Level Indicators.

There was a performance slippage for answering the Terrorism Hotline during May due to a high number of nuisance calls received from a disturbed individual.

Since July the number of calls received from the public has risen sharply, levelling off in September/October, at twice the level seen earlier this year.

#### Royalty, Diplomatic & Palace of Westminster Protection Group

An illegal intrusion into Windsor Castle in June has resulted in an independent review of Palace security.

SO16 is currently undertaking extra counter terrorism patrols and supporting Boroughs through the use of Diplomatic Protection Group mobile units.

It is now possible to differentiate SO16 6 minute response target calls from other "I" calls and the data has been reworked accordingly. After 7 months of this financial year, the number of calls to Embassy Warning System (EWS) alarms is more than double that for the whole of 2002-3. This is believed to be the result of enhancements made to the data collection methods used by switching from manual to computer based incident recording.

There is 100% provision of armed security to Palace of Westminster and Ceremonial & State events. These tend to take place in June (Trooping the Colour & Beating the Retreat) and November (Festival of Remembrance, Remembrance Sunday, State opening of Parliament & Allied Jewish Ex-Servicemen parade). In addition SO16 is heavily committed to guarding visiting heads of state and others.

#### SO17

Palace Of Westminster

SO17 is actively monitoring the effectiveness of staff response to alarm activations as part of a wider review of alarm systems across the parliamentary estate. The consistent failure of staff to achieve the 3 minute response in 90% of cases has led to a review of the patrol strategy.

The Alarm Review Working Party will present a number of recommendations to the SMT by mid-December 2003 regarding the future procedures that should be considered to ensure that all alarm activations are responded to appropriately. These recommendations will include such things as:

- 1) the response time targets
- 2) the staffing of the Control Room
- 3) improved availability of details of each alarm.

The offensive weapons seized at Strangers' Gallery in October 2003 consisted of a lock knife and two CS spray cans. The two sprays were seized from female foreign tourists. In some countries women carry these legitimately for personal protection and they do not realise that they are illegal in the UK. The 3 weapons identified in a single month at Strangers'Gallery, led to the target been exceeded that month. It should be noted that the overall performance for the seven months from April 2003 has seen the overall objective being achieved.

## 3

#### **Policy Support**

SO19 F

Force Firearms Unit

SO19 ARVs are deployed to Directed Patrol Boroughs which have been identified through intelligence as 'gun crime hot spots'. Gun crime intelligence is continuously reviewed to ensure that resources are focused onto the critical Boroughs. It has proved difficult to produce accurate statistics regarding the activity of ARVs, this will be resolved with the roll-out of Mobile Data Terminals.

In the YTD satisfaction rates for SO19 courses achieved an average of 91%. SO19 provides a variety of types of firearms course ranging from police recruit familiarisation to Tactical Advisor training.

**Heathrow** 

The last incident of terrorism at Heathrow was in March 1994.Heathrow OCU continues to develop and practice contingency responses to terrorism at the Airport.

## **Special Branch**

SO12

SO12 has maintained its strong performance exceeding both its remaining High Level Indicators. A Year To Date figure has not been included for Operations against Priority Targets, this is to reduce double counting as operations may overlap two or more months; last years figure related to March 2003 only.

#### **National Identification Service**

SO4

Performance for all three SO4 High Level Indicators has improved since they were last reported.

The Character Enquiries unit is now handling c. 10,000 Enhanced checks each week for the Criminal Records Bureau (CRB). Performance on turnaround times is substantially better than target, currently 90% of checks are being returned within 5 working days - although this varies with the level of incoming work. The costs of the unit are fully re-imbursed by the CRB.

National Security Vetting is performing at 100%, comfortably exceeding the target although volumes are currently roughly half what they were in 2002-3.

Method Index has shown improvement on performance reported for 2002/03 (74%) and now operates at above target levels (YTD 85%) on volumes which have reduced by about 25% on comparable 2002-3 levels. However, the mix of requests and a new prioritisation methodology has led to more complicated and longer searches receiving a higher priority in order to provide a service which meets the Priorities of the MPS - to reduce the incidence of street crime and burglary (Objectives 2 & 3).
