

The National Intelligence Model (NIM) Minimum Standards are on line to be completed by 1st April 2004.

The January 2004 ACPO NIM inspection went well and the MPS was applauded for making significant progress towards compliance. The MPS is now looking towards concluding the outstanding issues and working towards the Aspirational Standards and the NIM Codes of Practice. Additionally work continues on the 'Crimint Plus' programme which will update the MPS intelligence IT system.

The non-compliant areas are due to the size and complexity of the MPS. Currently unable to meet IT issues. IT pilot due to start 25th April 2004.

Finally 118 of the 185 Analysts have been appointed.
